CHALLENGES

Challenges were::

- 1: some of the pregnant women could not not breast feed their child when they're hungry as such tend to give the baby water or any food at their disposal
- 2: One of the participants draw my attention to the fact that one of her baby stop sucking at a very young age (3 months) so she can't force the child
- 3; Another said she couldn't eat healthy (balanced diet) because of 'Tinibu's regime,' na Weytin she see she go chop 4: One said, there's no health care facility in her village so she had to come all the way to Lafia and the cost of transport is high and that makes her to miss some of her medical appointments
- 5: Hardship is the key point of many.

URGENT ACTIONS

- 1:One of the action they suggested was that ,we are supposed to bring some nutritious food stuff for them to encourage them.
- 2: Another one said that the price of fuel should reduce as that will help with the hardship
- 3: the government should declare free medical care because a lot of people died in the hospital for lack of funds to pay for commencement of treatment.
