- 2. Add the amount of food per person
- 3. Food should be providing 2 times a day

OVERALL SUMMARY

Dialogue aimed at amplifying the voices of children on school meal. Children were able to able to provide their opinion on how school meal is provided in their school. Children were able to dialogue and provide their opinion in the following topics (performance measures)

1. issues of food availability at their school

- 2. Food quality
- 3. Frequency the meal is served

- 4. Overall satisfaction with the service of school meal
- 5. What should be done to improve school meal service in their school

On discussion about the food availability, "Food currently is available but it is not enough and were worrying because if World Vision will stop providing food in our school, we will not be able to get food again" We are therefore requesting our parents and government to have plan to continue providing food if World Vision Stops providing food for us On discussing food quality, one of the respondents' said foods does not have enough cooking oil and therefore it is not taste and also beans are not enough

On discussion and providing opinion through score card about frequency the meal is served, children responded that they are taking food once per day while they spend about 7-8 hours

On issues of satisfaction, one of the responded said that " sometime the que is very long, and we are using more time to get food" Another discussant said that "food is available, but we are eating only one food every day"

The discission ended by children providing their request/ask to government, parents, CSOs and private sector to continue providing food at their school.
