SECTION TWO: FRAMEWORK AND DISCUSSION

MANAGEMENT

The interview began with prayer followed by the presentation of the World Vision agents including Jean Pierre Beya and papa milan. After the presentation, the world vision agents will point out: the moderator got to the heart of the matter punctuated in these the key concepts, the groups most affected by malnutrition, the factors that have exacerbated the malnutrition and world hunger, the importance of good nutrition, the determinants (what contributes to a) of good nutrition there. Results and/or impacts of improved nutrition in children Following this presentation, it were some clarifying questions. And immediately after these clarifying aspects, the participants were divided in two large groups, each of which had to answer 4 questions (1° what is the nutritional situation of your site? 2° Talk about the challenges related to nutrition in this site? 3° what urgent actions can be taken to overcome these challenges? ? 4° What commitments should be made for already local management of malnutrition in your region?). It has been asked the participants to highlight the divergent and convergent points. The plenary intervened to bring together the fruit of the discussion of two groups.

DISCUSSION

The discussions between participants took place in two groups and focused on 3 questions, namely: nutritional situation of the country the major recommendations. This the challenges of malnutrition in the country

The exercise ended by noting the points of convergence and divergence between participants in the groups where they were distributed. Immediately after this exercise the participants returned to the plenary. During this implementation common They presented the results of the work that were compiled to obtain the synthesis in terms of challenges, urgent actions and other perspectives.

SECTION THREE: RESULTS OF THE DIALOGUE

CHALLENGES

The following challenges were given by the participants:

- Unemployment of several residents
- Uncleanliness
- Low salaries of other parents who are workers
- Overpopulation of the city
- Lack of supervision of farmers

URGENT ACTIONS

The following actions have been identified as priorities and urgent:

- Raise awareness among the population about good family cleanliness practices.
- Job creation by the Congolese state -
- Increase workers' salaries and pay them on time - Raise awareness among parents about unwanted births - Modernize agriculture - Increase seeds in their environment including niebe - Learning sessions . but, amaranth, cabbages

AREAS OF DIVERGENCE

There were no different countries because the participants all had the same problems in their environment.

GENERAL SUMMARY

Central Kasai is a stable region, but it is severely affected by malnutrition, both child and maternal. In discussions with the communities, catastrophic statistics of malnutrition in the Kasai area were noted, so much so that one would think one was in an emergency context.

This nutritional dialogue session opened with prayer, which was followed by the introduction of the participants, despite the fact that most of them already knew each other. Then came the time for discussions, which was sequenced with presentations, group work, brainstorming sessions and guided plenary sessions. Thus, the nutritional dialogue organized at the Mwimba Primary School in Kananga in Central Kasai was an opportunity to review the problem of malnutrition in Central Kasai. The participants active in the discussions were invited to be more realistic and truthful in their interaction.

Thus, after the summary on the problem of malnutrition, the interactions pivoted around three salient points: the nutritional situation of the region, the challenges of malnutrition in the region, the major recommendations. In the discussions, the participants were divided into two large groups. The results of the work in the crossroads were discussed in plenary. Thus, this exercise resulted in the conceptualization of a synthesis that took into account the harmonized opinions of each. In terms of content, the participants recognized that the major problems of malnutrition are first intrinsic and that efforts are needed at all levels to overcome them.

SECTION FOUR: PRINCIPLES OF ENGAGEMENT AND METHOD

PRINCIPLES OF COMMITMENT

Participants committed to relaying the awareness message within the community to other key stakeholders, mainly community leaders who have a strong voice with various social sensibilities.

METHOD AND FRAMEWORK

This nutritional dialogue included presentations, brainstorming sessions, team work and guided plenary sessions.

TIPS FOR OTHER CONVENERS

For future sessions, participants preferred that this dialogue take an awareness-raising stance so that it would spread to the community level.
