SECTION THREE: WORKSHOP RESULTS FOR CHILDREN

CHALLENGES

In the avalanche of challenges identified by children - A bad we can note the following:

legacy of the Kamuina nsapu phenomenon which has further made the populations very poor to the point where some families have difficulty making ends meet - The exacerbated poverty of families where only one

parent works and the other does not work. And even where parents work they are underpaid.

- The laziness of a large section of the population who do not want to work in the mining wanting to get into business and sector where the benefits are not very tangible The weakness
- of state services which provide less information on this question of malnutrition.
- Poor road conditions which do not promote the rapid flow of food products in several centers.
- Little entrepreneurial culture among the population

URGENT RECOMMENDATIONS FOR ACTION

Following the recommendations and urgent actions to be taken the following points were found:

- Support parents with an amount that can allow them to start an income-generating activity
- Raise awareness among parents about fund management
- Have seeds available to be used in fields, given that many of the fields were destroyed during the Kamuina Nsapu period
- Have reliable health structures that can provide health care to community members with quality care

AREAS OF DIVERGENCE

Most children claim that this crisis is due to the KAMUINA NSAPU phenomenon, while others have estimated that there are other endogenous causes because even before Kamuina Nsapu there was still malnutrition.

GENERAL SUMMARY

Although in a context of stability, the nutritional dialogue. Ilebo town and territory remain affected by malnutrition. held in Ilebo center, within the premises of a local school, EP of June 30 began with a summary of the problem of malnutrition and famine in the DRC.
