SECTION TWO: FRAMING AND DISCUSSION

MANAGEMENT

Above all, presentations were made on these different concepts to be covered to enable a good understanding of certain concepts before the group work that the participants had to do on certain questions given by the presenters. According to the participatory approach, the exchanges were conducted in an interactive manner, with questions and answers and share experiences

DISCUSSION

the focus was on In this meeting which brought together the leaders of religious denominations of the territory of Luebo on the issue of malnutrition in the said site. The meeting began with a presentation by the community leader who made a summary on malnutrition (definition debate contributing factors \dots) . This presentation was followed by a where participants both asked clarifying questions and others gave contributions on the local realities of the nutritional issue. After these interactions there was work at the intersection followed by an update in common.

SECTION THREE: DIALOGUE RESULTS

Some of the dice during the discussions were listed:

- Lack of support in the agricultural sector for the community
- Lack of good seeds (seeds certified by the state service: SENASEM)
- Insufficient agricultural production
- Poverty of the local community
- Lack of awareness
- Lack of good nutritional practices (preparation, combination of foods to establish balance)
- Low community engagement in agriculture
- Lack of popularization of agricultural techniques

URGENT ACTIONS

To the authorities:

- Raise awareness in the community as the growing season begins to move towards agriculture, the student,
- Capacity building of certain members of the community on cultural practices,
- Technical monitoring of farmers by territorial inspectors responsible for agriculture and phytosanitary products,
- Awareness raising on the fight against malnutrition;
- Improve agricultural service roads

To the partners:

- Market studies and connecting countries to agricultural input markets;
- Invest in human development through training in agriculture, crop treatments, training of agri-multipliers;
- Support the improvement of agricultural service roads To the communities:

- Promote agriculture, fishing and livestock farming,
- The implementation of good eating habits and food hygiene,
- Create groups of educational mothers
- Organize community fields and gardens

AREAS OF DIVERGENCE

In the discussions

no differences were noted between groups

GENERAL SUMMARY

The nutritional situation in the LUEBO territory remains worrying, due to a vicious circle of poverty, unemployment, low agricultural production, poor nutritional practices and the lack of basic services. However, local solutions and the efforts of each individual will help to fight food insecurity by promoting community fields and gardens, as well as raising awareness of the importance of agriculture in human life.		
A call is made to all stakeholders: government, humanitarian partners and communities to act together to ensure healthy and sufficient food for all, especially for children and women.
